Project MORE Training Costs

Initial and Follow Up Trainings:

NOTE: A Follow Up Training (3 hours) will be scheduled to take place 6 weeks after the Initial Training (5 hours)

\$750 for first school building within district, 1-5 people
\$395 for second school building within district, 1-5 people
\$375 for third school building within district, 1-5 people
\$350 for each add’l school building within district, 1-5 people

\$75 per training manual, required

Mileage charged for any school requesting training to be held at their determined location

Optional: \$500 per school building for end-of-year wrap up meeting to ensure fidelity of implementation of Project MORE for optimal results

With some initial expense for training and implementation, schools will gain a highly successful reading intervention program with minimal annual cost.

AN EVIDENCE-BASED READING INTERVENTION PROGRAM SINCE 1999

- meets the criteria for 21st Century Schools and Third Grade Reading Improvement and Monitoring Plans (RIMP)
- aligns with Ohio’s Learning Standards
- can be applied to RTI Tier 2 and 3
- 1:1 instruction by volunteers
- 30 minute sessions
- 4 times per week
- for students with disabilities
- for students identified as not on track
- intensive intervention at student’s reading level
- easy to use
- cost effective

The mission of Project MORE is to help every student maximize their reading potential, no matter their ability level.

Project MORE is:

Effective - students with mild disabilities **gain one month reading level** for each month 1:1 mentoring is received (according to independent evaluators from BGSU's Center for Evaluation Services) through this evidence-based practice

Affordable - Project MORE schools receive a **discount price** Reading A-Z/Reading-Tutors as reading content for the mentoring sessions

Replicable – organized, systematic, and low cost for training makes it **easy to replicate with fidelity**.

Sustainable – because of **low cost, easy to use, community/volunteer partnerships and student success**

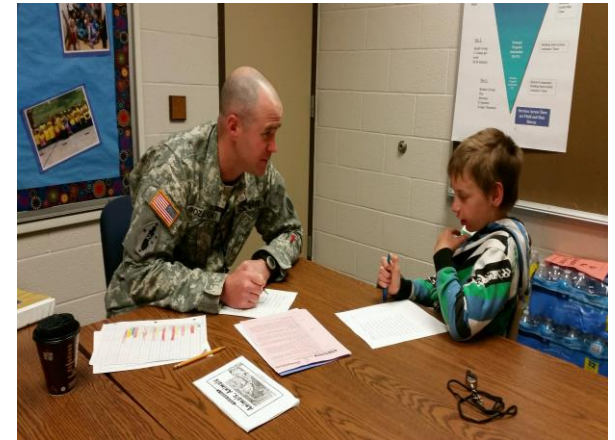
